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## Heads up – lights and sirens drill, Friday 11 April

On the last day of term, we will be participating in an emergency drill with some of the local emergency services.

Our drills at school are quiet and orderly. We practise regularly, but some students still get a bit agitated when they hear the alarm signal. If there is ever an emergency, such as a bushfire or event where people are harmed, it won't be quiet and orderly. There will be lights and sirens, there could be strange people shouting, running and giving orders. There could be smoke or flames visible. The last thing we want is a child taking fright and running away in fear, so we want to run a drill that is a little bit more like the 'real thing' (though we don't intend to provide any smoke or flames during our drill!).

I can't provide any more information because I don't have it yet, and the emergency services need to keep some sense of surprise around the event for it to be useful.

Students will be told about this drill. They will be told about what might happen, and they will have the chance to ask questions. However, particularly if your child suffers from anxiety or has autism, you may wish to start discussing the event with them now.
